#### Road Closure (Broome Road)

Broome Road, east of Garbutt Road, will be closed to traffic during the month of August for approximately four weeks in order to replace the bridge over Cedar Creek. The project has been delayed due to high water levels.

The Cedar Falls Conservation Area can be accessed during this time via the east end of Holomego Road where a temporary road has been put in place to access Broome Road east of the bridge being replaced.

#### **Fire Permits**

#### FIRE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL BURNING

Fire permits are required during the fire season which runs from April 1st to October 31st as per the Forest Fire Prevention Act. A permit is required before starting a fire outdoors, including the burning of grass, brush and for the use of Incinerators.

Fire permits are valid for 15 days and an incinerator permit is valid for the entire fire season. Permits may be revoked at anytime at the absolute discretion of the Township's Fire Chief Henry Mattas.

(Fires for cooking or warmth do not require a fire permit)

# TOWNSHIP OF O'CONNOR PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT REPORT FOR YEAR 2013

The Municipal Performance Measurement Program is an initiative of the Ontario government. It requires all municipalities to measure their performances in the following municipal service areas: general government, fire and police, roadways, transit, waste water, storm water, drinking water, solid-waste management, parks and recreation, libraries and land use planning. Within these service areas, municipalities are required to collect data on efficiency and effectiveness measures. Taxpayers increasingly want to know how their taxes are being spent and how well their services are being delivered. Over time, this program will give our municipality a common set of data to compare our performances and costs year to year and provide greater accountability to the taxpayers. For the year 2013, we are required to report on the following categories that are relevant to our municipality:

**Local Government Services:** Operating cost for governance and corporate management – 37.0% total cost – 31.6%. Total municipal administration includes salaries, wages, employee benefits, materials, contracted services, rents and financial expenses less Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) expenditures.

**Fire Services:** Operating fire protection costs: \$1.04 per \$1,000 of property assessment, the total costs -\$1.59 per \$1,000 of assessment. Fire Protection includes operating and maintenance costs of the fire hall and equipment and training of volunteer fire fighters. There were 7.299 residential structural fires per 1,000 households with 0 fire related civilian injuries or fatalities.

**Police Services:** Total police services cost - \$35.17 per person. Services are provided by the Ontario Provincial Police. The Township has the lowest incident rate in the area.

Total number of actual incidents - violent crimes (7) – 10.219 per 1,000 persons

Total number of actual incidents – property crimes (5) - 7.299 per 1,000 persons

Total crimes (criminal code offences, excluding traffic) (0) – 0.00 per 1,000 persons

Youths charged -(1) - 0% youths charged per 1,000 youths

#### **Road Services:**

**Winter Road Maintenance** - Based on operating costs – \$362.32 per lane kilometre. Based on total costs - \$377.29 per lane kilometre. The operating costs per lane kilometre associated with winter road maintenance include snow plowing and sanding, scrapping roads and pushing back drifts.

#### Winter Event Responses – 100%

This municipality has a standard of plowing roads when snow accumulation is 2" to 4" and sanding as needed.

**Summer Road Maintenance** - Based on operating costs – \$1,755.78 per lane kilometre. Based on total costs - \$2,324.45 per lane kilometre. The costs per lane kilometre included grading, dust control, ditching, brushing, and gravel re-surfacing of approximately 4.8 lane km. The Township of O'Connor does not have any paved roads.

**Bridges** – Based on operating and total costs of the surface of all bridges and culverts -\$0.10 per sq. metre. The percentage of bridges and culverts that are rated as good to very good – 63.1%

#### Solid Waste (Garbage) Services:

Waste Diversion – Residential solid waste diverted for recycling – 19.9%. Garbage disposal per household – operating costs - \$59.50, total cost - \$63.42. Solid Waste Diversion – operating and total costs \$30.32 per household. The Township of O'Connor operates one disposal site. There were 0 days when a Ministry of Environment compliance order was in effect and there were 0 complaints received in the year concerning the collection of garbage or recycled materials. To prolong the lifespan of the existing site, the Township began recycling in 1995 and since 2006 we have been using a compacting truck to compress solid waste that cannot be diverted.

The other services noted above are none applicable to the Township.

Section 33(1) of the Municipal Elections Act provides that a person may be nominated for an office by filing a nomination with the Returning Officer in the Clerk's Office in person or by an agent. The nomination shall be in the prescribed Form 1 (Nomination Paper), signed by the person being nominated and accompanied by the prescribed nomination filing fee. The fee is \$100.00 for Councillors and \$200.00 for Mayor. The fee is to be paid by cash, certified cheque, money order, or by telephone and on-line banking.





The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is a non-native, highly destructive wood-boring beetle that feeds under the bark of ash trees. All species of ash are susceptible to attack, except mountain ash, which is not a true ash species. Since it was first identified in Michigan in 2002, EAB has killed millions of ash trees in Southern Ontario and many parts of the United States and is making it way into Northwestern Ontario. It poses a major economic and environmental threat to urban and forested areas.

The human movement of infested materials such as firewood, logs, branches, nursery stock, chips or other ash wood is the most common way EAB has been spread. Adult Emerald Ash Borer can fly, but research indicates adults usually fly a short distance upon emergence. Please do not move firewood or other wood materials from other areas. To reduce the risk of spreading forest pests, buy and burn firewood locally.

# **Excerpt from the OPP From July Newsletter**

#### SAFETY MESSAGE FOR ALL BOATERS

Every year in Canada, hundreds of Canadians drown. Most of them never planned to be in the water, they were just enjoying their boating activity. Over 87%, are not wearing a life jacket or a PFD (or they were not wearing it properly) when they drowned. When it comes to PFD or lifejackets close isn't close enough. Wear your lifejackets or PFD and make every boating outing a return trip.

#### Lifejackets:

A Canadian approved standard life jacket, when worn properly, it is designed to turn an unconscious person from face down to face up in the water, allowing them to breathe. The standard lifejacket is keyhole style and comes in two sizes— one for people who weigh over 90 lbs and one for people who weigh less then 90 lbs. Standard life jackets must be orange, red or yellow with a whistle attached.

#### **Personal Floatation Devices:**

A Canadian approved PFD is designed to keep you afloat in the water.

PFD were designed for the use in recreational boating and are usually smaller, less bulky and more comfortable than lifejackets. They have less floatation than lifejackets and have limited turning capacity, but are available in a variety of styles and colours.

#### SAFETY MESSAGE FOR ALL MOTORIST

Ontario boast some of the most scenic driving for those who live and visit the provinces rural communities, but it comes with a cost with more than 10,000 drivers a year being involved in wildlife collisions. OPP data shows that spring and fall are when motorist driving in rural areas need to be extra cautious as wildlife become more active. It is important to remember that deer, moose and elk crossing signs are only posted where there are frequent sightings or crossings, however these animals can be seen anywhere any time. Drivers should therefore maintain a heightened level of awareness when driving in rural areas that are absent of these signs.

The OPP is reminding motorist that they can take precautions to reduce their risk of a wildlife collision:

- Scan the road ahead from shoulder to shoulder.
- Watch your speed and be careful when driving at night, slowing down will give you more time to respond
- Brake firmly if an animal is standing on or crossing the road, stopping if necessary. Swerving to avoid hitting a wild animal may result in loss of control, and a more serious collision.
- Do not direct your full attention to the animal when you take measures to avoid hitting it, because this is almost always result in colliding with the animal instead, focus your attention on the alternative route you decide to take, again only if this maneuver doesn't place you and others in danger



Homeowners may receive up to \$25,000. The actual amount received depends on the repairs approved under the program. 
