

Fire Department News

Since the last newsletter the O'Connor First Response Team have responded to three medical related calls and a Motor Vehicle Collision in the Township.

The O'Connor Fire Department Auxiliary has been fundraising for the purchase of equipment for the Fire Department and First Response Teams. In the past year alone we have raised funds that allowed us to purchase 22 new pagers that were required as a result of changes to how Thunder Bay area fire departments are paged out. We have also purchased a new metal chainsaw, a stability kit for vehicle rescues and a gas monitor just to name a few items. Total cost of these items alone was approximately \$15,500.00. We would like to thank everyone who has supported our various fundraising events that made the purchase of these items possible.



TVOKids and the Office of the Fire Marshal (OFM) are teaming up once again to raise awareness about the importance of working smoke alarms by asking Ontario families to test their smoke alarms.

Last year's very first TVOKids Push the Button campaigns, held in the Spring and Fall were a tremendous success. This year's Spring campaign begins on February 25th and ends on March 10th.

We encourage everyone in the Township to "Push the Button!" and test the smoke alarms in their homes. Kids at home will love the permission to "Push the Button!" to hear if the alarms are working.

Once they've tested their smoke alarms, kids are encouraged to go to tvokids.com and enter into TVOKids interactive smoke alarm the number of alarms they have tested. The number will be added to TVOKids "Push the Button!" counter. Kids will also be able to print a special "Push the Button" certificate.

Please note: TVOKids.com is an English language website and so the "Push the Button" certificates are only available in English.

Remember! Smoke detectors save lives.

The O'Connor Fire Department does have smoke detectors for sale at a cost of \$10.00 each and they can be picked up at the O'Connor municipal office during regular office hours.

Ontarians generate almost 13 million tonnes of waste each year – that's a tonne per person. Some household products like paint, solvents and pesticides contain hazardous materials that can be harmful to the environment if improperly managed. It is important to note that the Township of O'Connor Disposal Site cannot accept these materials. We must do our part to keep these materials out of our landfills and waterways and keep our environment clean.

Do your part to manage household hazardous waste by using the BUDS system:

- > BUY only what you need
- USE it up
- > DIVERT what you don't need
- SAFELY DISPOSE of container and any residue.

Safe Snowmobiling Starts With Being Well Informed

Many of the rules governing motor vehicle drivers apply to snowmobile operators, such as speeding, failing to stop at a road crossing and driving with a Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) that exceeds the legal limit. Failure to comply with the law carries penalties including fines, loss of driver's licence, criminal charges and/or imprisonment. A rider whose BAC is between 0.05 and 0.08 (know as the "Warn Range"), can be issued the same 3-day warning that suspends a driver's licence on the road.

To ride legally, snowmobile operators must always carry:

- Valid driver's licence (or if under age 16, a Snow Vehicle Operator's Licence)
- Proof of snowmobile ownership
- Sled registration (including properly placed registration numbers and validation sticker on sled)
- Proof of sled insurance (pink slip)
- · Approved snowmobile helmet for each rider
- While snowmobiling for recreation on an Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs (OFSC) Prescribed Trail, a 2013 Snowmobile Trail Permit (properly displayed on the sled) with permit receipt

The OFSC and the OPP also advise snowmobilers to get properly trained. The OFSC offers two courses approved by the Ministry of Transportation (MTO): OFSC Driver Training is a 6 hour classroom style course for snowmobilers aged 12 years and older. The Right Way is an interactive version of Driver Training for adults. Information about both courses is available at ofsc.on.ca

EXPRESSWAY IMPROVEMENTS!

Thunder Bay Expressway included in Ontario Government's Northern Highway Investments

The Thunder Bay Expressway could be seeing significant improvements. Our government recently announced an important step forward.

- A preliminary design study and environmental assessment on the Thunder Bay Expressway
- The study will identify improvements on a 13-kilometre section along Highway 11/17 between Arthur Street and Balsam Street
- Upgrades at the following intersections will be examined:
 Balsam; Red River; John; Oliver; the Harbour Expressway and Arthur
- Improvements would include widening to a four-lane divided roadway and building new interchanges
- Study will begin this summer and is expected to be completed by the end of 2014

Safety and operational improvements on the Thunder Bay Expressway were completed in 2011.

This is one of the ways our government is reaffirming our commitment to Northern roads and highways.

Since 2003, we've invested \$4.5 billion in Northern Highways.





Am I Eligible?

To qualify, you must have at least one appliance as shown in the "primary appliance" category below. If you have at least one "primary appliance," then we will also pick up window air conditioners and dehumidifiers.

Primary appliance: Full-sized refrigerators and full-sized freezers must be:

- between 10-27 cubic feet
- in working condition (plugged in 24 hrs prior to pick up)
- 15 years of age or older.


Secondary appliance: Window air conditioners and dehumidifiers must be:

- in working condition
- 10 years of age or older
- window air conditioners must be removed from the window prior to pickup and placed near a power source.

Note: An individual 18 years or older must be home during the scheduled appointment time to sign the appliance release form.
